QWEST GRANT APPLICATION & DETAILS NOW AVAILABLE

T he Qwest Foundation has allocated \$50,000 to the Montana ACTE through a Qwest Foundation for Education Grant to be awarded to Montana K-12 Educators who demonstrate innovative uses of technology in the classroom. The funds will be disbursed to local school districts on a competitive basis.

The purposes of this grant are to recognize Montana K-12 Educators who will use technology or training in innovative ways in the classroom to improve student performance, increase the use of technology in the classroom by sharing proven methods of how teachers are using technology to improve student performance and to improve teaching and leadership skills of educators. The funds may be used to purchase the following for use in the classroom: supplies and materials, software and hardware, or professional development activities.

Any supplies and materials, software and hardware purchased become the property of the school should the teacher leave the school.

The funds will be available during the 2010-2011 academic school year. The funds must be spent by June 30, 2011.

The proposals most likely to be selected for funding will use technical equipment or training as part of an innovative project in the classroom – either a new project or an existing program that can be taken to another level. Requests for equipment (e.g. iPods. whiteboards, projectors, calculators, etc.) that will essentially be integrated into existing projects and curriculum, however worthy, will probably not be selected. It is also unlikely that proposals which lack sustainability will be selected (e.g. one time funding for field trips or FIRST LEGO robotics team entry fees, etc.).

The grant application process will be administered by a partnership of Montana ACTE and Qwest.

Applications are available at www.montanaacte.org.

The application deadline is July 2, 2010.

According to the many business teachers who have attended this conference for over 20 years, WBEA is the best regional conference in the nation!
