MBITE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT UNDER

t the MBITE Business Meeting on Friday, October 17, 2008, a name change from MBITE (Montana Business and Information Technology Educators) to MBEA (Montana Business Education Association) will be discussed and voted on.

The reason for the proposed name change is to align our association with National Business Education Association (NBEA) and Western Business Education Association (WBEA), which

changed from WBITE in May 2008.

Over ten years ago our association was called MBEA and was changed to Montana Business and Information Technology Educators to encourage non-business teachers who taught computers/technology to join our organization. This has not happened as we had hoped, either in the State of Montana, regionally or nationally.

At the Western Business and Information Technology Educators conference held in Scottsdale, Arizona, in May 2008, WBITE was changed to WBEA.

Thus, the constitutional amendment would align Montana with the national and regional associations.

This idea was discussed during the MBITE Business Meeting during the 2007 conference in Bozeman.

Greetings to all from your MBITE Membership Director.

For as long as I have been teaching, and probably longer, there has been some confusion regarding the membership connection between MBITE and Montana ACTE/ACTE. This spring during the June Montana ACTE board meeting, your MBITE representatives worked with the Montana ACTE board to help bring clarity to this muddled situation.

While MBITE is affiliated with National Business Education Association (NBEA), MBITE is also a division of Montana Association for Career & Technical Education (Montana ACTE). MBITE receives funding for professional development through Montana ACTE's Carl Perkins leadership grant by

being a division of Montana ACTE. These monies are used to support MBITE activities during the yearly October meeting and the MBITE Summer Update.

As a division, MBITE members must also be Montana ACTE/ACTE members. Therefore, MBITE is ceasing the distribution of the MBITE Membership Form. All MBITE dues need to be paid along with Montana ACTE/ACTE dues.

This clarification only affects a small handful of MBITE members as almost all of our members are in compliance and are paying MBITE and Montana ACTE/ACTE dues.

Professional MBITE are still \$15.00, Montana ACTE dues are \$15.00, and ACTE dues are \$60.00. A membership form is included in this newsletter, dues can be paid with registration for the Big

Sky Pathways Institute, and can be paid online by visiting the Montana ACTE website, www.montanaacte.org.

Membership dues can be paid using Perkins or State CTE dollars and are tax deductible if you pay out-of-pocket.



GUIDELINES (REVISED MAY 2006)

Eligibility

- Senior or graduate student attending a college or university seeking certification to teach business courses OR
- Teacher of business education with ten or fewer years of teaching

Amount of Scholarship

- Each scholarship for attendance at a USA conference is \$500
- Each scholarship for attendance at an international conference is \$1,000
- Maximum of \$3,000 awarded in any one year

Use of Scholarship Funds

Scholarship funds must be used to defray expenses for attendance at:

- NBEA or
- SIEC/ISBE International Conference or
- Regional NBEA conference with some international sessions

Application Process

- 1. Obtain an application form from the ISBE website (www.isbeusa.org) or the fall ISBE newsletter
- 2. Determine the international project to be used for the scholarship requirement. (See attached list for suggestions)
- 3. Summarize the project on the application form
- Submit completed application form by December 1 and send it to President, USA Chapter ISBE, c/o National Business Education Association, Reston, VA 10919-1596 for scholarship in the next calendar year.
- 5. Receive notification of the results of the application review by February 1.
- 6. Attend conference and keep track of expenses paid
- 7. Submit request for reimbursement, along with appropriate receipts, to President of the USA Chapter of ISBE along with completed project and documentation no later than three months after attending the conference.

Expectations of Recipient

- Attend conference proposed and actively participate
- Using material prepared for scholarship or other international material, present a session at a state, regional, or international conference
- Continue to promote and advocate international business education

Guidelines for ISBE Board

- 1. President to receive application forms by December 1
- President to verify qualifications and send each application to each member of the Scholarship Committee by December 15
- The Scholarship Committee members shall evaluate the proposed project, rate it on a scale of 1 10, and compile the
 results of the three evaluations. They will then make recommendations to the ISBE Board for awarding the
 scholarship(s)
- Approval (or not) of the application(s) by the ISBE Board should be made by January 15 and the awardees notified by February 1
- The recipient(s) will pay the expenses incurred for the conference and submit receipts to ISBE for reimbursement along with documentation of completed proposed project
- 6. The recipient(s) will be reimbursed pending approval of the project(s) by the President and one other member of the Board or the Scholarship Committee
- 7. The President should encourage and assist the recipient in disseminating the results of the project
- This process can be modified with the approval of the ISBE Board. Any changes must be advertised at least 1 year in advance of their implementation or they may be implemented immediately with approval of the Board and the membership

Project Suggestions

- An article outlining the development of an activity for incorporating international business into business education classrooms.
- 2. An article reporting some research on international business. This may be classroom action research or more formal research.
- 3. Development of minimum of 200 international questions to be used in ISBE newsletter with answers and explanation of answers.
- An article to be used in the ISBE newsletter or a more formal article reporting on your visits to international businesses with some comparison and analysis.
- An article which could be used in and ISBE or SIEC publication regarding some aspect related to international business or the teaching of business subjects in an international setting.
- 6. An article on use of the Internet to teach international business with Internet addresses, etc.
- Philosophical article including some references on the effect of world events on international business with suggestions for discussion/activities.

WBEA PDI (PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE)

AN OPPORTUNITY TO NETWORK, ENERGIZE, AND DEVELOP LEADERSHIP

T he health and relevancy of professional associations at the local, regional, and national levels rely on the involvement of teachers and administrators who will share their talents and time for the betterment of our profession.

The challenge to continually train new leaders and reinvigorate the veterans is ongoing. In 1999-2000 the WBEA Board, under the leadership of President Mary Ann Lammers voted to institute a professional development opportunity at the annual conference and support this endeavor by paying for ½ of the registration fee for two participants from each S/T/P. Some S/T/Ps have supported veteran teachers who are continuing to provide inspiration to members and want a "refresher" opportunity.

Having a registration fee paid has also provided financial support for those teachers who do not have the support of their districts or colleges.
