The world's first French fry museum, The Frietmuseum opened in 2008 just outside of Brussels in the city of Bruges.

Belgian lore that states that they, in fact, invented frites, which became known as the French fry during World War I.

Belgian troops introduced U.S. soldiers to the snack, and the Americans assumed the French-speaking Belgians were French.

Since the end of the Second World War, Brussels has been the political capital of Europe—the city is home to EU institutions, North Atlantic Treaty Organization headquarters, international organizations, politicians, diplomats and civil servants. It is also the capital of European Union and Belgium.

Standing at 26,000 square meters, the justice palace in Brussels is the largest court in the world.
