## New Standards for 2021: Overview and Planning for Implementation OPI Learning Hub Course Now Available

July 1, 2021, marked the official implementation date of five (5) new sets of Montana K-12 content standards—Career & Technical Education (CTE), Computer Science, Library Media and Information Literacy, Social Studies, and Technology Integration.

To support Montana educators learn more about the new standards and to offer ideas and resources for implementation, the Office of Public Instruction has developed a new course on the <a href="OPI Learning Hub">OPI Learning Hub</a> titled "New Standards for 2021: Overview and Planning for Implementation".

The "New Standards for 2021" course takes participations through an overview of each of the five new standards and includes details about what is new within the standards, direct access to each set of K-12 standards, links to planning and instructional resources, model curriculum guides, and connections to Indian Education for All.

Educators who successfully complete the "New Standards for 2021" will earn three (3) OPI renewal units. The course can be completed during one sitting or can be completed over multiple sessions as time permits.
