Eligibility Criteria:

--Demonstrated critical financial need (must be eligible to receive the Federal Pell grant as determined by completion of the FAFSA)

--Demonstrated perseverance in overcoming adversity

Funds may be used for tuition, fees, books, and supplies. All scholarship funds are paid directly to the institution on behalf of the recipient.

Fun Facts & Trivia

Pay Day was designed by the American game designer Paul Gruen, and released in 1975, and it was the designer's biggest hit.

Pay Day is also known as *PAY DAY* and *Payday*.

Pay Day has been produced in a number of different languages including Italian, French and Dutch.

There are a number of editions of *Pay Day* which include the original 1970s one; the 1990s edition; the 2000s 'Big' version, which has a customizable game board with interchangeable day tiles; and a 2011 modernized version of the original known as the 'Classic Edition'.

The original version of *Pay Day* featured a savings account; however, this feature was removed in the 1990s game.

Pay Day was very favored when it was first released; competing against the sales of Monopoly, although it has not remained as popular.

Players go through a range of different situations that involve paying bills, making deals, helping out the neighbors, and even receiving birthday gifts.

The game smartly introduces concepts like interest and loans to younger players, in turn helping to educate them about the power of savings and investment.

In the 1994 edition, the game was updated to 24 "Deal" cards and 48 "Mail" cards.

Another update was an increase in pay on pay day to \$3500 at the end of each month.

Additionally, the "Pot" was renamed to "Jackpot" in the 1994 edition.

Additional special board spaces included Super Ski Sunday, Charity Concert, Food for the Month, and Shopping Spree.

In the 2000 updates, Pay Day became known as Big Payday.

In *Big Payday*, the board completely changed to allow for tiles to replace existing days, adding variety to the game.

Also, new card types were added, such as "Instant Messages".

The *Pay Day Rivals Edition* board game has two players going head-to-head in a battle to end up with the most money to win.

In this fun game about making and spending money, each player moves their pawn around the game board, finding bargains and unexpected windfalls.

Players deal with bills that come in the Mail cards such as having to pay library fines or to cover a pedicure.

Event cards can bring surprises such as winning cash at Bingo or paying for a night on the town.
