Apply Now for the Montana Quality Educator Loan Assistance Program

Through House Bill 211, the 2019 Montana legislature renewed the quality educator <u>student loan</u> <u>assistance</u> program as a recruitment and retention aid for rural schools. The Office of Public Instruction is responsible for administering the program. Applications for the <u>Montana Quality Educator Loan</u> <u>Assistance Program</u> will be accepted from February 1-March 31, 2022.

Newly hired quality educators who teach or work in a subject that has been identified as a "critical quality educator shortage area" at an "impacted school" are eligible to receive state paid loan assistance for up to four years, so long as they remain a full-time employee at an impacted school.

The <u>program</u> provides for up to \$3,000 of state-funded loan repayment at the end of the first year of teaching, up to \$4,000 at the end of the second year, and up to \$5,000 at the end of the third year. In addition, the school district has the option to offer up to \$5,000 at the end of the fourth year, but this is entirely a local decision.

That means you can apply to possibly attend this professional learning program at reduced or no cost to you/your school. AVID is planning on offering both virtual and in-person/hybrid summer workshops during the summer of 2022, and will switch to all-virtual if needed.

The <u>Career & Technical Scholarship Program</u> is funded through the generosity of Horatio Alger Association Members, Jim F. Dicke II and Dennis Washington. Scholarships are awarded to students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their lives who wish to pursue a career or technical education at an accredited non-profit post-secondary institution in the United States.

Eligibility Criteria:

- --Have completed high school (or earned a high school equivalency credential)
- --Enrolled in eligible program in Fall 2021
- --Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a career or technical program (up to 2 years) at an accredited non-profit post-secondary institution in the United States
- --Demonstrated critical financial need (must be eligible to receive the Federal Pell grant as determined by completion of the FAFSA)

Fun Facts & Trivia

Quidditch: The Board Game is a Harry Potter inspired board game and was released in 2000.

Players control 14 quidditch pieces on a hex board quidditch field.

Three goals are locked in place on opposing ends, with each team's player standees arranged by their goals.

Teams take turns rolling and moving, turning over tiles to search for the snitch, or finding quaffles to shoot through the hoops.

Various other tiles reveal bonuses and penalties.

When a player wants to score with a quaffle, he loads a quaffle ball into a miniature catapult and tries to launch it through hoop, scoring 10 points.

If a seeker token finds the snitch, the team scores 150 points, ends the game, and more likely than not, wins.

Quidditch is a 7-on-7 sport that is essentially 95% handball and 5% capture the flag. Flying on broomsticks, most of the players on the field are concerned with throwing a ball through one of three hoops on the opposing end of the field.

The other 5% involves one player from each team trying to snag the Golden Snitch.

Catching the Snitch is worth 150 points and ends the game.

Whichever team has the most points after the Snitch is caught wins the game.

In a live game, there are over 700 unique fouls that can occur during a game of Quidditch and it is the job of the game's referee to be on the lookout for each and every single one of them during every game of Quidditch.

According to lore, myth, and legend, Quidditch is one of the longest-running games in wizarding history (and probably muggle history as well if we are being honest), as it has been played regularly for nearly 1000 years as the official version of the game, can be traced back to a spirited game held in the year 1050 at Queerditch Marsh.

Though Quidditch is a long-standing wizarding tradition, it is important to note that the sport (at its inception) was originally the combination of five other magical sports.

Elements from each one of these sports were taken and combined to create the sport that we all know and love—Swivenhodge provided the quaffle and chasers; Stitchstock provided the keepers; Ainginein provided the scoring hoops; an unnamed Scottish game provided the beater and bludgers; and the game of Shuntbumps provided the tradition to attempt to knock players off of their brooms.

The companion novel, *Quidditch Through the Ages*, which provides readers with historical information on the game, fun facts, and a brief overview of the main rules of the game was originally published in the muggle market by author J.K. Rowling in the year 2001.

Quidditch is not just for the movies (or for wizards) anymore as the infamous sport has crossed over into the muggle world as universities, clubs, and rowdy groups of friends across the globe have picked up their broomsticks and engaged in the beloved sport for themselves.

In fact, this sport is regularly played in twenty-six different countries.

Selling more than 500 million copies worldwide, the "Harry Potter" books have been translated into 80 different languages — recently, Scots, a language spoken as a first language by90,000 people.

Harry Potter and the Forbidden Journey ride opened with The Wizarding World of Harry Potter at Universal's Islands of Adventure in Orlando on June 18, 2010.

Since then, subsequent versions of the ride have opened at Universal Studios Japan on July 15, 2014, at Universal Studios Hollywood on April 7, 2016, and at Universal Studios Beijing on September 20, 2021.
