#### **Summer Professional Development from Code.org**

<u>Code.org</u>, and regional training partner Avid, are offering professional development opportunities for Computer Science Discoveries and Computer Science Principles during the summer 2022.

<u>Computer Science Discoveries</u> is designed for grades 6-10 and <u>Computer Science Principles</u> is for grades 9-12. Curriculum is open-source and available at no cost.

Trainings for each curriculum/course is nine (9) days total. This includes a five-day (week-long) summer training and four one-day workshops (all virtual) spread throughout academic year (usually one per quarter). This equals roughly 54 hours of professional learning.

Summer trainings will be held in-person in Seattle (WA), June 27-July 1, and virtually August 1-5. Click here for more information.

New for this year is <u>AP Computer Science A</u>, being piloted for first time in 2022-2023. Computer Science A is designed for grades 9-12 following the completion of Computer Science Discoveries or Computer Science Principles.

<u>Training for AP Computer Science A</u> will be held June 27-July 1 in Seattle (WA) and in Boise (ID), August 1-5. Please note, a virtual training for Computer Science A is not available.

The cost for all trainings is \$1,500. Participants are responsible for their own food, travel, and lodging expenses. <u>Scholarships</u> are available to cover the cost for all 6-12 trainings, <u>apply today</u>. Scholarships are awarded based on availability to those with the highest site-based level of need, factoring in two

federally identified criterion: (1) percentage of students at the site (local district/school) receiving freeand-reduced meals; and (2) percentage of students at the site (local district/school) who are part of an underrepresented community.

Renewal units or college credit (vis UC San Diego) are available.

### Additional Perkins Funding Available through the 2021-2022 Rural Reserve Grant

The purpose of the <u>Rural Reserve Grant</u> is to create career awareness, recruit, and retain students within a CTE Secondary Program of Study that leads to a high skill, high wage, or in demand occupations.

There are currently 176 schools offering over 260 Career and Technical Education courses to students in grades 5-8 in Montana schools; the most offered course is in career exploration. Since Montana does not receive enough funding to provide Perkins's funding for middle school programs, this year's Rural Reserve Grant will be to encourage pathway work for the middle grades.

Schools could use the funds to help

- --establish innovative delivery methods for career exploration;
- --expose students to employability skills earlier;
- --establish foundational elements for work-based learning; and
- --improve transitions from middle grades into secondary Career and Technical Education pathways.

Grants of up to \$5,000 each will be awarded to secondary Perkins-eligible school districts to support CTE work in the middle grades (5-8). Schools MUST have completed the Perkins Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA) and E-Grant application as well for the 2021-2022 Grant cycle.

#### **Fun Facts & Trivia**

Advance to Boardwalk is a 1985 spin-off of the Parker Brothers board game Monopoly.

Like its predecessor, *Advance to Boardwalk's* setting is the real-estate world in Atlantic City, New Jersey, but focuses only on the boardwalk.

Advance to Boardwalk involves the building of hotels, which are constructed by the various players who place markers to indicate the growing floors of the hotels.

More than one player can have floors in a given hotel, but much like *Monopoly*, advantages can be gained by owning a majority of floors in a given hotel.

The board begins with a series of empty lots along the boardwalk, arranged in color groups, and laid out with property value cards.

Trespassing dice are thrown: two standard numeric six-sided dice, and a special color die.

The total number tells the player how much they are allowed to spend; the color die tells the player within which color group they can spend.

The color die could also tell the player that they can build in any color group (when the die comes up as a "W", for "Wild"), or that they have to draw a card (when the die comes up as an "F", for "Fortune Card").

When building, the player can place as many hotel floors as he or she likes on as many properties as he or she is able to, up to the total numeric amount shown on the dice, and within the color group indicated.

Opponents can "take over" a hotel, and take the property value cards for the hotel, by building more floors on an existing lot.

In the event of ties, the color closest to "ground level" keeps the property value card. In the event of a "takeover", the player who gains control of the lot can move his or her token up the boardwalk in the amount equal to the property, and his or her opponent's token down the boardwalk in the amount equal to the property.

"Fortune Cards", collected regularly, allow players to take advantage of construction bonuses, natural disasters, and other events to add and remove floors.

Cards are picked up when an "F" is rolled (which usually overrides construction in that player's turn), or when certain spaces on the boardwalk are reached, marked with an "F".

The first player to pass \$35 million in hotel property value wins the game.

Atlantic City's boardwalk is the longest in the world, spanning spans 5.75 miles and also runs through Ventnor.

Atlantic City's historic boardwalk was the world's first boardwalk, built in 1870.

The boardwalk was once over seven miles, but it was partially destroyed by a 1944 hurricane.

Disney's BoardWalk is an entertainment, dining, and shopping area within Orlando's Walt Disney World Resort.

First opened in 1996, the BoardWalk Resort lies in the Epcot Resort, alongside Crescent Lake, and is situated between Epcot and Disney's Hollywood Studios.

Disney's BoardWalk is a quarter-mile promenade with a colorful vintage theme, based on turn-of-the-century coastal piers like Atlantic City.
