The 2022 Payback Challenge—Over \$70,000 in Scholarships for Students Available

<u>Next Gen Personal Finance</u> (NGPF) is excited to announce the <u>2022 Payback Challenge</u> with \$70,000 of scholarship funding for high school students.

The <u>Payback Challenge</u> is NGPF's annual scholarship contest that gives students a chance to win a \$2500 Grand Prize for their educational pursuits while developing an understanding of what college life will be like. More than \$70,000 in scholarships is available.

The challenge is based on NGPF's Arcade Game, Payback, which allows students to simulate financial decisions to get to and through college. Afterward, they respond to the question: What did you learn from the game that you'll be able to apply to your future experiences?

How to Enter

- 1. Have your students play Payback in class or at home
- 2. Students write a 250-word essay OR create a 90-second video
- 3. Collect your students' responses and nominate ONE student entry for the Payback Challenge Scholarship.

The following prizes will be awarded:

- --National Grand Prize: 2 winners at \$2,500 each. All entries are eligible.
- --Honorable Mention: 45 winners at \$1,000 each. Remaining entries are eligible.
- --Fee Grant Districts: 22 winners at \$1,000 each (2 per district). Students from Financial Empowerment & Equity (FEE) Grant districts are eligible

Applications for 2022-2023 Perkins Rural Reserve Grants Now Open

Applications for the <u>Montana Perkins Secondary Rural Reserve Grant</u> can be submitted for the 2022-2023 grant cycle. The purpose of this year's <u>Montana Perkins Secondary Rural Reserve</u> grant is to create career awareness, recruit, and retain students within a CTE Secondary Program of Study that leads to a high skill, high wage, or in-demand occupations.

There are currently 176 schools offering over 260 Career and Technical Education courses to students in grades 5-8 in our Montana schools. The most offered course is in career exploration. Since Montana does not receive enough funding to allow us to provide Perkins funding for middle school programs this year's Rural Reserve Grant will be to encourage pathway work for the middle grades.

Schools could use the funds to help:

- --establish innovative delivery methods for career exploration
- --expose students to employability skills earlier
- --establish foundational elements for work-based learning
- --improve transitions from middle grades into secondary Career and Technical Education pathways.

<u>Grants</u> of up to \$5,000 each will be available to secondary Perkins eligible school districts to support CTE work in the middle grades (5-8). Schools will have had to complete the Perkins Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA), and their E-Grant application must be approved for the 2022-2023 Grant cycle before applying.

Schools that were awarded in previous years are eligible to apply, however, preference will be given to new applicants. The 2022-2023 application can be downloaded from the CTE page of the OPI website under the Funding menu.

Fun Facts & Trivia

Disney's *Alice in Wonderland* is an animated version of Lewis Carroll's famous story of Alice and her adventures after falling down a rabbit hole.

Following a White Rabbit, she meets such strange creatures as a talking doorknob, who helps her through a keyhole into Wonderland, Tweedledum and Tweedledee, who tell the story of "The Walrus and the Carpenter," the Caterpillar, and the Mad Hatter and the March Hare celebrating an unbirthday at their tea party.

Finally, Alice has a showdown with the Queen of Hearts and her army of playing cards. The whole thing becomes such a nightmare that Alice awakens from her dream to the recitations of her sister and the purring of her cat, Dinah.

Alice in Wonderland premiered in England on July 26, 1951, and was released in the U.S. two days later.

An edited version aired on television on November 3, 1954.

Alice in Wonderland was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Scoring of a Musical Picture.

Alice in Wonderland had been on Walt Disney's mind since 1933, when he considered a live action version starring Mary Pickford

The film was rediscovered by the psychedelic generation, when it was made available on 16mm for schools, and it was rereleased in theaters in 1974 and 1981.

In 2010, director Tim Burton released a live-action version of Alice in Wonderland.

In Burton's version, a 19-year-old Alice is trying to escape from an unwanted marriage proposal and falls down a hole and returns to the whimsical world she first encountered as a young girl.

She has no memory of her previous visit, and her childhood friends the Mad Hatter, the White Rabbit, Tweedledee and Tweedledum, the March Hare, the Dormouse, the Caterpillar, and the Cheshire Cat wonder if she is the right Alice.

Tim Burton's *Alice in Wonderland* was released on March 5, 2010, in regular, 3D and Imax versions, after a February 25, 2010, Royal World Premiere in London.

The 2010 Alice in Wonderland stars Mia Wasikowska(Alice), Johnny Depp (the Mad Hatter), Helena Bonham Carter (Iracebeth, the Red Queen), Anne Hathaway (White Queen), Crispin Glover (The Knave of Hearts), and the voices of Alan Rickman (Absolem, the Blue Caterpillar).

The film won two Academy Awards, for Art Direction and for Costume Design.

The Alice in Wonderland Fantasyland dark ride attraction opened on June 14, 1958, at Disneyland.

Shanghai Disneyland is home to the Alice in Wonderland Maze Fantasyland attraction.

The Alice in Wonderland Maze was inspired by Tim Burton's *Alice in Wonderland*. Opened June 16, 2016, guests choose their own garden path and wind through giant hedges and flowers on their way to the Mad Hatter's tea party.

Along the way, they encounter the Cheshire Cat, the White Rabbit, and sculptures of other characters.
